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



Governor Hogan was sworn in as the 62nd governor of the State of Maryland on January 21, 2015. In 2018, he was re-elected to a second four-year term, receiving the most votes of any Maryland gubernatorial candidate and becoming only the second Republican governor to be re-elected in the 242-year history of the state.



Thank you to all of the outstanding committee members, volunteers and supporters of this significant annual WBC community service initiative. As always, we went well beyond the original scope of work again this year. Special thanks go to donating member firms Boston Properties, Consigli Construction, Dynalectric Company, Galen Photography, Ruppert Landscape and Shapiro & Duncan.

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The 2022 project was organized by House Captain Juliane Medd (Consigli), Co-Captain Jane Cherney (McCoy Associates) and Safety Coordinator Rob Wenger (WCS Construction). The workday was overseen by the Community Services Committee and Chair Vanessa Carrion (Stream Realty), Vice Chair Andrew Tomlinson (G&M Services) and Board Liaison David Stocks (Stocks Management Group).

House Captain Juliane Medd orchestrated a dedicated team of over 40 volunteers for the workday. Due to the typical level of skilled work involved with our assigned project, many tasks were handled by industry professionals provided by member firms. Work on the house included extensive yard cleanup, mulching, stair handrails, wheelchair ramp, electric upgrades, grab bar installation, HVAC/plumbing improvements, interior housework and more.

Together with corporate and community partners, the organization transforms the lives of low-income homeowners by improving the safety and health of their homes and revitalizing communities. Rebuilding Together local affiliates and nearly 100,000 volunteers complete around 10,000 rebuild projects nationwide each year.

Over the years, Rebuilding Together programs have rehabilitated over 135,000 homes and nonprofit facilities by utilizing over three million volunteers. Rebuilding Together provides home repairs free of charge and gives priority to those low-income households with older adults, persons with disabilities, and families with children. Rebuilding Together has over 200 affiliates that work year-round to preserve affordable homeownership and revitalize communities across the country.






With the efforts of over 61,000 community volunteers, local Rebuilding Together Arlington/Fairfax/ Falls Church chapter has repaired over 3,500 homes and non-profit facilities since becoming affiliated with the national program in 1988. Connected. Supported. Safe.

onstruction Safety Week is an annual industry-wide education and awareness event, a united show of force for the industry to reaffirm its commitment to safety as the foundation for everything we do. This year's theme, which was recognized May 2-6, 2022, was *Connected. Supported. Safe.* Being connected creates a sense of unity and shared purpose on a team. This helps people feel supported as part of a group and creates an environment where team members feel safe relying on others.

Reflecting the risks facing construction workers today, safety week has grown to encompass more than the physical well-being of employees on the jobsite. In recent years it has also expanded to highlight the importance of mental well-being on workplace safety and to open a dialogue about this difficult and often-taboo subject. The last several years have been extremely stressful for nearly everyone in the industry, with everyday worries compounded by a global pandemic, climate change, racial tension, economic insecurity, and political unrest. Across our jobsites and in our families, this stress is taking a toll at a time when mental health resources are stretched thin from unprecedented demand. A report from <u>Mental Health America</u> released at the end of 2021 found that:

- Nearly 50 million Americans almost 20 percent are experiencing a mental illness.
- More than half of adults with a mental illness do not receive treatment, totaling more than 27 million adults in the U.S. who are going untreated.

In the context of this mental health crisis, the initiatives of construction safety week have tremendous potential to connect vulnerable people to resources that can save lives. Awareness, acceptance, and care for mental health is a key component to being safe on the jobsite.

Accidents are more likely to happen when people are distracted or disengaged. When you are not fully present mentally, it's impossible to be totally engaged physically. Feeling connected to your team is a strong antidote to feeling distant or detached.

I first witnessed the positive impact of creating a safe team environment while playing team sports growing up and in college. The encouragement from coaches and peer support from being part of a team provided me and my teammates with a strong base of security and social acceptance that gave us the confidence to meet challenges and weather difficult experiences.

Those close relationships are actually a big part of what drew me to my current career. My college head football coach recognized my aptitude for promoting safety and introduced me to the field of EHS, providing both information and encouragement as I explored courses and career opportunities in safety. His genuine interest in my success reached beyond the playing field and even beyond college. A summer internship at Skanska with incredible mentors sealed the deal and set me on what has been an extremely rewarding career path in EHS.

Along the way I've incorporated a number of strategies in my work to build the kind of team spirit and relationships of trust that have been so beneficial in my own life. They form a foundation for how I approach my daily work responsibilities:

Say Hello: I am the guy who speaks to every person on the jobsite. It is my job, and my pleasure, to develop a rapport with each member of our team that keeps the communication lines open.

Build Respect: Building a culture of respect and support lets people know they can rely on you. Speak to people the way you want to be spoken to.

Celebrate Often, Offer Constructive Criticism: We forget how important it is to celebrate people's skills and talents every day. We all need kind words. If someone makes a mistake, choose your words carefully, don't yell, and offer constructive criticism.


Show Your Humanity: We all go through tough times, myself included. I cannot expect my team members to share their ups and downs if I am not also willing to be vulnerable in sharing about my own personal situation. I am comfortable having open conversations about mental health struggles and how they can impact workplace safety. This type of discussion empowers workers to speak up about their own challenges and be aware of colleagues who might be struggling so they can access resources for help.


While safety is under the spotlights during Safety Week, it is something I think about every day. In demanding jobs across the construction industry, a strong sense of community and support can make the difference between life and death as much as well-maintained equipment and diligence in following workplace procedures do. One of Skanska's guiding principles is *Care for Life*, and this is part of my job every day as I interact with workers and build team

morale. I bring my own personal experience to my job as an EHS professional at Skanska, and I hope that some of my humanity helps build trust with the people around me who are in my care.
